## Ephesians 3:17-19

"I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God."

Developing a habit of welcoming God's presence into our homes and practicing love like Jesus within our families is where the outpouring of revival begins.

## What does Jesus' love look like?

In 1 Corinthians, Paul shared how we can love like Jesus loves us.

## 1 Corinthians 13:4-7

"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."

This week, take some time to read 1 Corinthians 13:4-7. Enter into God's presence and ask the questions below. Over dinner, discuss your reflections with your family. (If you have kids, read through the verse and go through each question together!

- 1. Father, where am I falling short of loving my family members like Jesus loves me?
- 2. What is one way I can demonstrate the Jesus type of love to a family member this week?

At the end of the week, choose one commitment you want to make to help you become more rooted and established in Jesus' love.
