Sometimes it's hard to have hope—to believe that something good will come out of something bad—when we don't know what will happen. That's when we have to remember that God is with us and that God is in control. God sees our hearts and knows the things we're worried about better than anyone else. God knows what we need to pray even when we aren't sure how to pray. Remember whatever happens, God is bigger than your questions.
