# A BRIEF GUIDE TO INDUCTIVE BIBLE STUDY

## 1. Pray

ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT TO GUIDE YOUR STUDY AND FOR GOD TO REVEAL HIMSELF TO YOU AS YOU READ HIS WORD.

### 2. Observe

#### WHAT DOES THE TEXT SAY?

- 1. Ask investigative questions:
  - **Who** is speaking? Who are the main people? Who is being spoken to?
  - What is happening? What is the scene? What is the cultural context of the passage?
  - Where is the passage taking place?
  - When did or will the events take place?
  - How did people respond? How did Jesus react?
- Look for grammatical connections: repeated words, comparisons, contrast, cause, and effect.
- 3. Identify **keywords** and **phrases**.
- 4. Note verb tenses.
- 5. Look for **conjunctions** such as since and therefore. Why are those words in the sentence?

## 3. Interpret

WHAT DOES THE PASSAGE MEAN?

- 1. Answer a few questions based on your observations of the text.
  - If Jesus spoke, why did he say what he said? Why did people respond the way they did?
  - Why was this teaching important to the people in the original context?
  - How can that original importance relate to us today?
  - What is revealed about Jesus? What is revealed about God's Kingdom?
- 2. Try to **summarize** the passage in one sentence. What is the main point the author communicates to the audience?

## 4. Apply

WHAT DOES THE PASSAGE MEAN FOR ME?

- 1. How do you **respond** to what the passage is saying?
- 2. Does this passage challenge how you see the world?
- 3. Is there a central truth you can **put into practice**?
- 4. What are the implications of the passage for the community of which you are a part?
